# Phonics

## Number fingers!

Say a number between 0-10 to your child.  
Ask them to hold up that many fingers.  
Can they make the number using their fingers in a different way?

## Making dot patterns!

Find objects around the house. Give the children a number and see if they can count out the correct amount of objects and create the pattern that they would see on a dice for that number with the objects.
