Once you are logged on, there is a dedicated parent's page (<a href="https://www.twinkl.com/resources/parents">https://www.twinkl.com/resources/parents</a>). For primary-aged children, take a look at the <a href="5-11 area">5-11 area</a>. This was created with parents in mind so it's filled with guides and information about what children should be learning in each year group, for each curriculum area.

Another provider which we use frequently in Year 3, Classroom Secrets, has produced a free home learning pack for each year group which can be downloaded at home. It includes maths, English, GPS and practical ideas – much of which we've covered this year <a href="https://classroomsecrets.co.uk/free-home-learning-packs/">https://classroomsecrets.co.uk/free-home-learning-packs/</a>.

Although many of the resources can be printed out, we are aware that not all homes will have access to a printer. In many instances, the recommended resources can be accessed online but completed on paper.

## Reading

- Please encourage your child to read for pleasure as much as possible. This can be any book of their choosing. Questions to ask your child are at the front of the reading diaries.
- For age appropriate reading comprehensions, search for LKS2 Reading Comprehensions Bumper Resource Pack or LKS2 60-Second Reads Bumper Activity Pack on the Twinkl website.

# **Writing**

• <a href="www.onceuponapicture.co.uk">www.onceuponapicture.co.uk</a> has an amazing collection of images which can be used to inspire children to write and is also a great reading activity. Once you click on the image, you are provided with lots of discussion questions and reading questions too.

- <u>www.pobble365.com</u> is a great resrouce which also supplies a picture to discuss. In addition, you are given story starters, grammar activities and comprehension questions.
- For age appropriate writing activities, search for LKS2 Uplevelling Sentences Worksheets on the Twinkl website. This will allow for children to use their knowledge of adverbs, adjectives, expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials, prepositions and conjunctions to improve a basic sentence. The stars at the bottom of each page indicate the difficulty of the task with three being the most difficult. You can also use the search bar, type in year 3 grammar, to find appropriate work.
- There are lots of English and SPaG worksheets that can be printed off from <a href="www.Oxfordowl.co.uk">www.Oxfordowl.co.uk</a>.
   Click on the tab labelled 'kids activities' and select the appropriate subject.
- The spellings for this term are on the following page which the children can learn. Previous spellings in the children's reading diaries could also be practised.
