<p>Egyptian Story Write a story that is based in Egyptian times and try to be adventurous with your vocabulary. Remember to use paragraphs with a beginning, middle and end. (3/4 of A4 page)</p>	<p>Pharaoh Poster Research a famous Pharaoh like Khufu, Thutmose or Cleopatra and find lots of interesting facts. Create a Pharaoh Poster which includes captions, labels, heading and pictures. (A4 page)</p>	<p>Multiplication House! Choose a timetable to focus and create a multiplication house e.g. The house of 7s. The windows and door could have calculations on them then the answers could be underneath the flap.</p>	<p>Number Making - 2364 How many different ways can you make this number? You must use all four symbols! (10 different ways) Challenge: Can you choose your own four digit number?</p>	<p>Egyptian Materials Ancient Egyptians used metals for making containers and jewellery, and wood for making boats and tools. Can we make a list of which materials the Egyptians used for some common things like combs, buttons, shoes and clothing?</p>	<p>Egypt Map! Look at maps of Egypt and create your own map. Include the Nile river, pyramids and capital city. Draw animals, roads and Egyptian features on your map.</p>
<p>Conjunctions Write amazing sentences with conjunctions all about Egypt. Conjunctions you could use- also, then, but, because, and, although, however, as Challenge: Can you include noun phrases? (6 sentences)</p>	<p>A Day in the Life of... Imagine you were an Egyptian slave forced to build the great pyramids and work in the baking sun. Write about a normal day for a slave and think about all the hard work you'd experience. (Half an A4 page)</p>	<p>What's the question? If the answer is 250cm, what could the question be? Think of 10 different questions where the answer could be 250cm. Be creative in your questions.</p>	<p>Egyptian Board Game Design your own board game with an Egyptian theme but with a Maths element. Do the players need to answer your Maths questions correctly to move around the board and do they need to watch out for the Egyptian traps?</p>	<p>Canopic Jar! Create your own Canopic jar in any material you choose. Research Canopic jars and look the different symbols, colours and features.</p>	<p>Animals in Egypt In ancient Egypt, some animals were respected and represented as gods or goddesses; others were domesticated. Some animals were dangerous so people feared them. What can we find out about which animals lived in ancient Egypt?</p>
<p>Mummy Fact File Research all about mummies and find brilliant facts. Design your own fact file to explain how Pharaohs' bodies were mummified. Use a heading, sub heading, labels, bullet point and top facts. (A4 paper folded in any way you choose)</p>	<p>Egyptian Vocabulary Research Egyptians and find ten new words. Find their definitions and write them out clearly like a glossary. Challenge: Can you write your own sentences with your brand new words?</p>	<p>Pyramid Maths Create your own 3D pyramid and choose a timetable to focus on. Remember multiplication works with division.</p>	<p>Do you have your receipt? Ask an adult do they have an old receipt that you could borrow. Look at the amounts on the receipt and put them in order. Largest number to the smallest number. Challenge: Can you create calculations from the different items?</p>	<p>Pyramid Sketch Research pyramids and sketch the amazing shapes. Shade your pyramid thinking of your light, medium and dark shades. Try to create your pyramid out of one colour.</p>	<p>Egyptian Jewellery Egyptian Pharaohs wore lots of different jewellery to show their royalty. Create your own Egyptian jewellery in any material you choose.</p>
